

National Debate Competition Description



1. Rules

Eligibility

The National Debate Competition is open to teams of high school students from across the country. Each team must consist of two to four members, and they must be currently enrolled in high school.

Topics

The competition will feature a range of topics, which will be announced in advance of the event. The topics will be related to current events, social issues, and political affairs.
