






NATO Conference, Rome, Italy, 15-16 April 2024

"NATO AT 75: SHAPING A NEW TRANSATLANTIC AGENDA, SECURITY AND PEACE IN A TIME OF GLOBAL TRANSFORMATION".



On the occasion of the 75th anniversary of the North Atlantic Treaty that established NATO and signed in Washington on April 4, 1949, the Italian Society for International Organization (SIOI), in cooperation with NATO's Department of Public Diplomacy, organized an international conference in Rome, which discussed the main issues facing NATO today on April 15 and 16.

The conference was opened by the President of Italy, Sergio Mattarella.

Participants of the conference were experts from various fields (politics,

universities, diplomacy, military, research, journalism, young people from Italy and abroad). The conference was also attended **by Miralem Tursinović**, director of ORC Tuzla.

The conference aimed to contribute to laying the foundations for a new transatlantic security architecture in one of the most dramatic moments in the international scenario. During the course, thematic sessions were organized on the Russian-Ukrainian conflict, the future of Russia, deterrence and defense in an unpredictable security framework, the defense of democracy, individual freedoms and the rule of law, new challenges and competitions, stability in the Balkans and the Black Sea and security in the Mediterranean and Gulf regions.









"When little hands agree" - Youth group ORC Tuzla

At this month's meeting of the Youth Group of ORC Tuzla held on April 19 , Suzana Dušanić and Ema Jahić led a training workshop on the topic "Gender and gender norms". The workshop dealt with gender-based violence, prejudice and stereotypes and other types of violence. During the workshop, our Suzana explained the difference between gender and gender, while Ema explained the types and forms of violence, as well as the importance of gender-based violence and its consequences.



Also our **Almedina Đulović** gave a presentation on the topic "Writing projects according to the LOD method", which was interactive. Other members of the group actively participated in the discussion and sought answers to questions such as: Why do investors invest in projects? How to get from the idea to a concrete project proposal? How to predict certain expenses in the budget? We have tried to answer all questions in a team and motivate the members of the group to work out some of their own ideas in projects. As always, the meeting passed in a wonderful atmosphere with a lot of laughter and jokes.



The 5th regular session of the Assembly of the Youth Council of the City of Tuzla

On Monday, April 15, our **Suzana Dušanić and Nadina Mehić** attended the fifth regular assembly of **the Youth Council of the City of Tuzla**. At the Assembly was: adopted the report on work for 2022 and 2023, new leadership elected, Adopted amendments to the Statute of the Youth Council of the City of Tuzla.





By the votes of the delegates of the Assembly for the members of the Board of Directors of the Youth Council of the City of Tuzla elected: Lamija Redžepagić (Association "Youth of Tuzla"), Emina Morankić (Association "Youth Theatre of Tuzla"), Lejla Šarić (Association of Young Women "GirlTHing"), Admir Adilović (Tuzla Open Center) and Adnan Imamović (UG "Multi"). Lamija Redžepagić will serve as president of the Youth Council of the City of Tuzla in the coming period, while Adnan Imamović will serve as vice-president.





Academy of Excellence

Our Mirela Biković had the opportunity to work as a coach on the final module of the "Academy of Excellence" organized by the Bridge East West in BiH. The workshop was attended by 20 outstanding young activists from different cities. The topic was youth activism, participants had the opportunity to map problems in their local communities and test their knowledge through a quiz.







Use of social networks to promote the work of CSOs and cyber security

A training was held in Sarajevo, organized by the Peacebuilding Network, on the topic "Using social networks to promote the work of CSOs and cyber security".

Mirela Biković attended the training in front of the Tuzla Youth Resource Center. The training included the theoretical and practical part. Through the presentation of the theoretical part, participants gained information on the use of social networks in the promotion of the work of civil society organizations, with concrete examples from practice. Also, through the practical part, they acquired skills and knowledge on the application of methods and tools for the effective use of social networks to increase the visibility of organizations.

During April, we worked on maintaining and developing communications and coordination within the Youth Network of Bosnia and Herzegovina (www.orctuzla.ba). ACTIVITIES OF MEMBERS OF THE YOUTH NETWORK OF BIH



YOUTH ORGANIZATION "SVITAC"
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Daily workshops

The youth organization Svitac continued with daily interactive and online activities. The younger participants did creative and age-appropriate educational things, with the help of local and international volunteers. This month they talked about the evolution of humanity, changes in nature when the seasons change, the ability to remember and forget, the life cycle of frogs and butterflies, reptiles and photosynthesis. The youngest participants enjoyed the creative part and modeling of fun objects (e.g. various colorful ornaments, small frogs and butterflies made of paper and cardboard rolls). The group continued with music workshops, rehearsing rhythms and songs. Participants continued to learn Latin by practicing writing the letters O, P, R, S, S, T, U, and V. They did warm-up exercises and yoga for the kids, and every Thursday they danced, played sports, and practiced attention and concentration by reading and listening to stories (The Hen Who Carried Golden Eggs, Monkey and Cat, Beauty and the Beast). In the workshops of English, German and Turkish, they learned words related to drink, feelings, suggestions for a place, adjectives and opposites. The aim of these educational activities is for children to develop their imagination and to express their creativity using various materials, and to develop motor skills, memory, a sense of tolerance and respect for others and adopt good behavior. All workshops are implemented with an educational visual method with pictures and video.







Age 13+ participated in discussions/workshops on the topics of discrimination, prejudice, racism and conspiracy theories. In this way, we want to provide young people with a safe and neutral space, in which they can speak their minds.

In English and German workshops they worked on practicing grammar and everyday communication, reading and translating short texts and phrases, school homework and interesting projects.



Guitar workshops

Within the new songs, etudes and compositions that the participants worked on are: two etudes in C major (F. Sor, F. Carruli), "Dao Xiang" - (Jay Chou), three waltzes: "Tatiana, Andreina and Natalie" (Antonio Lauro), "Horse with no name" (America), "Smells like teen spirit" (Nirvana) and "Alive" (Pearl Jam).



Work continued on writing lyrics and composing melodic parts for two trombones on already existing harmonic arrangements. This practice is likely to continue in the coming period.



Music workshops (younger group)

The group continued to work on developing motor skills and practicing coordination of the left and right hands. Two authorial compositions were also rehearsed. Part of the time at the workshops participants spent listening to gustav holst's entourage: "The Planets".





Youth group exchange

Svitac welcomed a group of short-term ESC volunteers from Finland, who spent 14 days in the Brčko District. The main mission of the project was to contribute to the local community. Volunteers gave the necessary support to organizations in Brcko working with children and young people to promote solidarity and tolerance. The main activities included workshops on the occasion of Anti-Racism Day. They spent their first days exchanging cultures and learning about non-formal education. Every day they participated in a series of activities in the Youth Organization Svitac, the Center for Roma Youth and Fantasies (NGOs for disadvantaged children).



Together with our longtime volunteers and local participants, they experienced the exchange of different cultures, languages and experiences! International volunteers have had a positive impact on peacebuilding efforts during their daily activities.





International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination



March 21 is the International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination. Youth organization Svitac held workshop with high school students. Simon, an international volunteer from Germany, prepared a presentation and discussion. The group first discussed the 1936 Summer Olympics in Germany and how National Socialists used sports and games for their propaganda. He also highlighted the friendship between Jesse Owens and Luz Long, which

should be a role model for sportsmanship. (Members of the Nazi Party with Luz long are talked sharply after spending time with Jesse). Jesse and Luz became friends at the Olympics and corresponded for years afterwards. Jesse would say of his Olympic friendship with Luz: "It took a lot of courage for him to befriend me in front of Hitler".

In the continuation of the activity, we discussed how right-wing extremists abuse fans and sports clubs, especially football clubs. The students are also familiar with a club in Germany called "III. Weg", (III. Put - association to the III. Reich), which internationally cooperates with other right-wing extremist organizations. In the end, the students worked in groups, and shared their opinions about racism in their





city and their own experiences. The aim of the workshop was to inform students and talk to them about the problem of racism and discrimination in sports.



Earth Day

Earth Day is an important annual event on April 22 to demonstrate support for environmental protection. Planet Earth is also our only home and needs our help to thrive! Our duty is to participate in activities such as protecting nature, taking care of rivers and seas, collecting garbage and planting trees! Youth organization Svitac celebrated Earth Day with the youngest participants! We watched a video about our planet Earth and learned how to care for it. Our participants also painted the worksheets and made a beautiful poster with a large tree and children hugging it. The workshop was held in the premises of the Youth Center of Brčko District of BiH.





SVITAC World Book Day

World Book Day is celebrated on April 23 around the world to promote the book and encourage the desire to read among children and adults. UNESCO and other NGOs on this day, in addition to the campaign for the protection of intellectual property, promote the importance of literacy, access to knowledge, linguistic diversity in publishing and minority languages. Orla, a volunteer from the Svitac Youth Organization, led the English Club's workshop on World Book Day. To start the workshop, she made a quiz with a wide range of questions ranging from banned books to the history of World Book Day itself, which proved to be a very interesting activity. After the quiz, we continued to talk about our favorite books and personal reading experiences in the group. At advanced English workshops, we also talked about books and described our favorite book in a fun way while the other participants tried to guess which book it was. The activity revealed the creative side of the participants, and enabled us to learn something new!

Some of the quiz questions:

'Alice's Adventures in Wonderland' has been banned in the region of which country since 1931? When was the printing press invented?

In which country is the oldest library in the world that works continuously?

For May, the continuation of all activities of the Youth Organization Svitac is planned.





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Ahmići: thirty-one years later

On the occasion of the thirty-first anniversary of the war crime in Ahmići, the Association for Social Research and Communication (**UDIK**) and partner organizations from Croatia organized joint activities. On Tuesday, April 16, a protest stand was held on Ban Jelacic Square in Zagreb with the aim of reminding Croatian citizens of this war crime and the initiative to name a square in Zagreb after Ahmić victims. Later in the same day, a round table was organized in the Bogdan Ogrizović Library and Reading Room on the topic "After 31 years, are we ready to face the dark side of Croatia's role in the war against Bosnia and Herzegovina?". Journalist **Boris Pavelić**, writer **Ajka Tiro Srebreniković** and activist **Senna Šimek** spoke on that occasion. The interview was moderated by Novosti **journalist Jerko Bakotin**.





Citizens' Initiative for Remembrance and Commemorations



In order to continue promoting the active role of young people in society, as well as the importance of cooperation between the government and non-governmental sectors, UDIK has launched a network called **the Citizens' Initiative for Remembrance and Commemorations (GISK)."** The aim of this initiative is a joint civic and political engagement in the culture of memory, increasing social cohesion and diversity in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Young people who undergo non-formal education training are more prepared for the labor market, more active in the community and often encourage others to act and jointly seek solutions.

During the event, participants had the opportunity to engage in discussions and exchange experiences on important topics for civil society development in Bosnia and Herzegovina with participants from different sectors. The aim was to provide a comprehensive overview of the current state of civil society in BiH, as well as opportunities for progress and steps towards creating more productive communities in our country.

The main motivation for organizing this event is local development and progress, with the aim of raising awareness of the importance of mutual support and understanding the link between the empowerment of organizations and the development of local communities.

The event also included discussions with partner organizations from neighboring countries, presenting examples of successful methodologies implemented by local organizations, as examples of good practice.

Such events facilitate networking of representatives of NGOs, getting acquainted with different actors, exchanging opinions and experiences and forming partnerships. This is crucial for the potential cooperation, support and empowerment of civil society organizations, and therefore for the empowerment of the entire community.

The project "Sports Bridges for Youth Inclusion" is the result of cooperation between the Youth Club "Dijamant" from Jajce and the partner organization "Centre for Rural Development – SEE" from Struga, North Macedonia.

The main objective of this project is to bring together young people from different countries through sports activities and educational initiatives, in order to promote social inclusion, diversity and international friendship. This unique sporting event brought together

over 200 young people both from our country, as well as from North Macedonia and Austria. Guests from North Macedonia and Austria stayed for several days in Jajce with the aim of getting to know different cultures, traditions and to enable a better understanding of diversity and strengthening ties among young people. The international volleyball tournament and futsal tournament is an opportunity to emphasize mutual friendship and sports cooperation, by assembling teams from different countries and cities.

As the aim of this project is to promote inclusion, tolerance and diversity, the games were symbolically opened and the first game was played by members of the Association of Children with Disabilities "Waterfall of Love Jajce". Members of this association actively participate in the trainings of the Volleyball Club "Dijamant" Jajce, thus exchanging experiences with peers, developing their sports, communication and social skills, the organizers confirmed.



The International Volleyball Tournament "Sports Bridges for Youth Inclusion" was held on April 28, 2024, at 09:30 am in the Jajce City Sports Hall. The tournament was played on three courts in the categories of pioneer, pre-pioneer and cadet.

3. Competition for the annual award 'Milan Mladenović' for the best song of the former Yugoslavia



The competition for this year's "Milan Mladenovic" award, which is awarded for the best song in the countries of the former Yugoslavia, has been announced by the Endowment, which bears the name of the former frontman of the rock band Ekatarina Velika (EKV). This year's competition is being held under the slogan "Submit your thing", and is open until 31 May.

Authors and performers from all countries of the former Yugoslavia have

the right to apply for the award, with a song with lyrics in one of the languages spoken in the territory of the former Yugoslav republics, including the languages of minorities:

One performer, author or group of authors can submit only one song to the competition for the Prize.





- The right to apply for the Award has the author or a group of authors who, under the name under which they apply for the competition, published the first poem after 01.01.2017.
- Songs competing for the Award should be published between 01.06.2023. and 31.05.2024.
- Applications can be submitted by authors, performers or publishers via the form available on the Foundation's website: <u>milanmladenovic.com</u>.
- The competition concludes on May 31, 2024 at midnight.

The "Milan Mladenović" Award was established with the aim of encouraging musical creativity that distinguishes the values of Mladenović's artistic legacy, and is awarded for the best song from the former Yugoslavia at the ceremony on September 21st – the day of Milan's birth.

The winner of this year's award will be decided by a regional jury consisting of: Anja Rupel (Slovenia), Dubravko Jagatić (Croatia), Maks Juričić (Croatia), Nikola Vranjković (Serbia), Svetlana Đolović (Serbia).

The expert jury will first select 12 finalists who will be announced on a promotional compilation produced by the Foundation "Milan Mladenović", and the winners of this year's award will be awarded with 3,000 euros.
