Peace Bus 2018 - 2020

TAA has converted a former school bus into a moving cinema and theatre, traveling to marginalized areas across Lebanon. TAA develops rich screening programs and invites youth of diverse backgrounds to travel with us on a cultural journey. The bus facilitates discussions, films, concerts, storytelling and sharing of food. Theatre workshops and performances are held in, around, and on the bus to foster lasting bonds between divided communities. TAA implemented a project, within the Peace Bus, entitled "Watch Lebanon in Mobile Cinema" in 2018 and 2019, in 20 villages (Srifa, Mansouri, Arzon, Tirdeba, Maaraka, Jwaya, Tebnine, Al Qalila, AinBail, Borj Rahal, Abbasiya, Bazourieh, Tarf Lasai, Borj AlChamaly, Qana, Siddiqin, Deir Kanoun Ras Alain, Alma Alshaab, Marwahin and Briche).
