1. Introduction

El-Wedad Society for Community Rehabilitation (WSCR) is a nonprofit nongovernmental organization. It was established in March, 2001 to provide psychosocial and educational rehabilitation services, in addition to the development of the local community in Gaza Strip. It mainly targets children, women, youth, and elderlies where they receive equal services including training, counseling, guidance, and awareness in psychosocial and educational fields.

WSCR is a registered NGO in the Ministry of Interior, Palestinian Authority Lic No. 7134.

WSCR aims at implementing projects with long-term programs and forward-looking vision seeking the logical institutional development and permanent improvement that distinguish it from other institutions which work merely within a relief context. It works hard to achieve raising in the local community's efficiency, in addition to create positive view among community members in order to reduce the burden of responsibility on governmental organizations.

WSCR built its own head office building recently in Jame'at El Dwal EL Arabya Street, Tal El Hawa, Gaza, Palestine.

WSCR has shown a great interest in making use of community resources in its rehabilitation process. Depending on that, it implements activities that go in line with its policies as well as the Palestinian society's needs. It also contributes positively to the rehabilitation of children, youth, women, elderlies and PWDs.

7. Capabilities

7.1 Human Resources

7.1.1 Management Approach &tactic:

WSCR currently has a staff of more than 12 full-time employees with a large group of part-time employees and volunteers who are skilled and specialized depending on the projects' needs. Our staff is distinguished for its professional employees with more than 10 years of experience in community work including project managers, financial accountants, social workers and field supervisors.

WSCR's employees have proficient skills in reading, writing and communication in English, in addition to collective knowledge that enables them to solve work-related problems efficiently through team work.

This management structure creates flexibility and freedom within the organization and dynamic atmosphere in which each employee develops a part of thorough teamwork in order to meet the new needs of tasks.

7.1.2 Gender in the WSCR

WSCR services ensure Gender equality. The board of directors includes 3 females. Furthermore, there are 10 females occupies various positions in the association.

7.1.3 Access to Justice and Security in the WSCR

WSCR proceeded its role in promoting the rule of law and providing possible access to justice along with all its community services. Considering that this was not enough to achieve access to justice, WSCR worked on providing new levels of legal services for the community through the implementation of projects with legal nature to achieve that. During the last three years, three related projects were implemented by WSCR and funded by SAWASYA/UNDP. Those projects including Karama project, Mousharaka project, and Nazaha Project) aim at enhancing the rule of law, promoting the role of judicial institutions, and enabling citizens to reach an effective institution for justice.


















9. Our Partners






